- LS welcomed PCSO Jan Rice and PCSO Trevor Pattison to the meeting and thanked them for their hospitality.
- The minutes of the last meeting were approved.

### **Matters Arising**

#### LITTER AND DOG FOULING

- a) Litter between the inner and outer perimeter fences of Two Mile Ash School: LS raised this issue with an Abbey Hill Parish Councillor following the July 2016 meeting, having contacted the school twice to no apparent effect.

#### TRAFFIC AND PARKING

- a) Damage to the verge in Clay Hill opposite the junction with The Approach in Two Mile Ash: At the October 2014 meeting, the Councillor representative of Abbey Hill Parish Council reported that he had taken LS's suggestion of a verge parking order to the Parish Council, and the clerk had then written to Milton Keynes Council asking for guidance. The NAG has not heard of any developments since.

### **Chair's Report**

Given the poor attendance at meetings, there was a discussion on the direction of the NAG. JR and TP noted that the aims of residents associations had much in common with those of the NAG. JR and TP cited Fullers Slade Residents Association as a good example of a nearby association with strong local support, and suggested that LS get in touch with them. LS agreed to do this.

LS reported that she had contacted the distribution manager of a local free newspaper about a suspected difficulty with its distribution, and had been told that there was currently a shortage of distributors. (LS had recently tried to gain publicity for the NAG via the newspaper.)

MA reported that the EVA scheduled for Thursday 30<sup>th</sup> March in Hodge Lea had been cancelled because of the unavailability of volunteers to attend.

## **Thames Valley Police Update: PCSO Jan Rice and PCSO Trevor Pattison**

JR and TP reported that the last month had been fairly quiet for crime in the NAG area. To illustrate TP noted that there had been 44 calls from Two Mile Ash (a relatively small number for such a large estate). These involved a few instances of anti-social behaviour, some parking issues, one burglary and a number of domestic incidents.

JR noted one instance of motorcycling on the redway in Hodge Lea, and explained TVP's policy on addressing such incidents. The guiding principle is that any intervention must be proportionate.
